Homer W. "Hawk" Kiefer spent 25 years in the military after graduating from West Point. He served in Alaska, Vietnam, Germany and Saudi Arabia. He commanded a battalion in the 25th Infantry during the Tet Offensive and the 41st Field Artillery Group at Babenhausen West Germany. While with the 82nd and 101st Airborne Divisions, he became a senior paratrooper. He has earned the Silver Star, Bronze Star, and Purple Heart, among others.

He obtained his Master's Degree at Columbia University in 1957, and subsequently taught English at West Point.

He is a newspaper guest columnist and a former Rotarian club president.

In retirement he has written about the American Indian Wars, the Philippine Insurrection, both World Wars, Vietnam, and the Middle East.
